We have provided a list of different accessories that are recommended by us and compatible with the new MacBook Airs.

## Mice

### Best budget mouse:

Logitech M535 Bluetooth Mouse ~ \$28

### Best compact mouse:

Satechi M1 ~ \$30

<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>Compact</b></li><li>• <b>Inexpensive</b></li><li>• <b>Rechargeable</b></li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>Not ideal for large hands</b></li><li>• <b>May require more frequent charging than others</b></li></ul>

# Best full size mouse:

Logitech Triathlon M720 ~ \$40

<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>Extra customizable buttons</b></li><li>• <b>Rechargeable</b></li><li>• <b>Connect up to 3 different devices without re-pairing</b></li><li>• <b>Comfortable for small to large hands</b></li><li>• <b>Acts as a wired mouse while charging</b></li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>More expensive than budget options</b></li><li>• <b>Only designed for right handed users</b></li></ul>

# Best touch gesture capable mouse:

Apple Magic Mouse 2 ~ \$80

Pros	Cons
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>Supports touch gestures (pinch to zoom, swipe etc.)</b></li><li>• <b>Compact</b></li><li>• <b>Rechargeable battery</b></li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>Price</b></li><li>• <b>Mouse cannot be used while charging</b></li><li>• <b>No physical scroll wheel</b></li><li>• <b>Uncomfortable for large hands</b></li></ul>
